
CAMPUS MINISTRY

President's Message

Thank you to all of our parents who lent their signatures to the online petition launched in September to encourage the Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development to have the province's Water Ways office complete its determination for the school's new campus on 24th Avenue in South Surrey. As a result of this petition we received the determination 28 September. This clears a major milestone for the project in that we can now engage the City of Surrey on obtaining its environmental approval, a requirement to submit the building permit application to get the school built.
