Almsgiving /Generosity during Lent

Every year, Lent offers us a providential opportunity to deepen our closeness to God and stimulates us to rediscover His mercy. To help us on our journey, the Church proposes three ancient practices to foster the process of our interior renewal: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, or works of charity and generosity.

During this holy season, we meditate on God's generous love. His nature is to "give away" unselfishly. Jesus, who was God, did not consider equality with God as something to be clung to, but "emptied himself," taking on the form of a man, indeed of a slave. By His obedience unto death on the Cross, He redeemed us (cf. Phil 2:5-8). This was the greatest of generous acts!

Christians who are aware of having received everything from God gratuitously should show similar benevolence. Today, unfortunately, such gratuitousness is often not part of daily life, where everything is calculated and measured. Giving generously, however, leads to freedom from the obsession of possessing and the fear of losing what we have.

What, then, does almsgiving teach us? It teaches us to share with others whatever we have received from God's goodness. But it isn't mere philanthropy; almsgiving is a concrete expression of charity to individuals and contributes to the building of a more just and compassionate society. Most importantly, such generosity imitates what Jesus did: by dying on the Cross, He gave Himself fully for us.

According to the Gospel, we are not owners but rather stewards of the goods we possess. God entrusts these goods to us so that we can practice the virtue of generosity. St. Teresa of Calcutta wisely wrote: "If God, who owes nothing to us, is ready to impart to us no less than Himself, shall we answer with just a fraction of ourselves?"

Giving generously impacts our life. Scripture teaches us that our hearts rejoice more in giving than in receiving (cf. Acts 20:35). When we act generously out of love, we express the truth that we are created in God's image and likeness; that is, we have been created not for ourselves but for God and for our brothers and sisters.

Every time when, for love of God and far from the spotlights, we are generous with what we possess, we discover a great treasure. Our generosity is returned to us as a blessing in the form of peace, inner satisfaction and joy. What is more: among the spiritual fruits of almsgiving is the forgiveness of sins: "Charity," writes St. Peter, "covers a multitude of sins" (1 Pet 4:8).

Giving generously during Lent, particularly in the form of almsgiving and sacrificial giving, expresses Christian love and solidarity with others, as well as being a means of deepening one's spiritual life and contributing to the creation of a more just society.

A few years before the opening of SJP2 in 2018, I met Troy Van Vliet sitting in the Good Shepherd church welcoming area at the information table for the school. Having been a parishioner since 1989, I had heard many rumours of a new Catholic high school in South Surrey. So I listened to Troy's spiel, doubting that this project would ever happen and thinking this school will not be around for any of our children even if it did open. Well, I have to say now that I should not have been that "doubting Thomas." As it turns out our daughter Lizzie became a graduate of the Legacy Class of 2023.



Chris and I have four children who attended Star of the Sea School from 1994 to 2016. Our youngest, Lizzie, took a longer path to graduation. After three years at the Eaton-Arrowsmith school in White Rock, it was time to transition back to a regular curriculum. As luck would have it, SJP2 was up and running and happened to be down the road from our house at the Star of the Sea Centre. We met with Mr. Deslauriers, the first principal of the school, and Lizzie enrolled for grade 9 in September 2019. Another classmate from Eaton Arrowsmith, Katherine, joined Lizzie, and the two became part of the 12 graduates of the Legacy Class.

We are so grateful for the many opportunities Lizzie had during her 4 years at SJP2. The pandemic did create a few obstacles in her grade 9 year, as it did with everyone. Lizzie learned to navigate the world of online learning and Zoom meetings. It was an interesting time! What we experienced in our four years at SJP2 was that the caring and attentive staff were able to give Lizzie the support that she needed to achieve a Dogwood diploma. In grade 12, Lizzie was awarded the Cliff Annabel Scholarship for Community Service as well as the Knights of Columbus award for Community Service. We could not be prouder of Lizzie's accomplishments, and we credit the school staff for their care and help in these achievements.

An invitation to attend World Youth Day in Lisbon was a highlight. Bernadette Yuson, an English and Humanities teacher at SJP2, invited the grade 12 students to join her on the pilgrimage to WYD. Catholic Faith in action with 1.5 million young adults, sisters, and clergy. Lizzie desperately wanted to go to WYD, and I was asked to accompany as a chaperone. It was a truly life-changing experience. Being able to practice your faith with hundreds of thousands, which included the Pope, many bishops, and cardinals, as well as pilgrims from around the world, is simply amazing.

In these times where there is so much confusion and discord, it is comforting for our family that schools such as St. John Paul II Academy are still being built. A Catholic high school where the timeless teachings of Christ of kindness, love, and forgiveness are taught and practiced. How my mother ignited the flame of Social Justice

Growing up in an Irish family, social justice was not a word we used, but it was a way of life. I am one of eight children; part of a typical Irish Catholic family. My mother instilled in us a deep sense of empathy, compassion, and a commitment to making the world a better place. We were not wealthy, but we always had enough, and that "enough" was shared. Sunday dinner was special, but in addition to my own family, I never knew who might be around the table.

In our home, diversity was not just accepted but it was celebrated. Again, I did not know this "buzzword" and it really represented the alcoholic who on his way home from the pub would come to our house for a cup of tea to wait for one of my brothers to drive him home as it was too far for him to walk. Or the lonely old woman whose family had all moved to England for work. She got Sunday dinner delivered; dinner prepared by my mother and delivered by one of my older siblings. This was "Skip the dishes" or "DoorDash" at its finest.

My mother did not shy away from political issues as we lived in a time that was known as "the Troubles" We learned about systemic injustices and the power of advocacy to create positive change. I have vivid memories of participating in a "Civil Rights March" protesting the lack of housing available to Catholic families at the young age of 13.

As I think about my childhood, I am grateful for the influences of my mother. She instilled a responsibility to work towards a more just and equitable world. These lessons have helped shape who I am today, and it is why I have been involved in social justice everywhere I have worked.

From "Service to Advocacy"

At the beginning of this school year, Colleen Girvin and I, along with nine students, attended a two-day workshop at the John Paul 2 Pastoral Centre in Vancouver. This workshop was hosted by St. Thomas More Collegiate with the goal of guiding students along a journey from "Service to Advocacy." Additionally, it provided an opportunity for SJP2 students to connect with students from other Catholic high schools.

Since September, these students have been meeting once a month to develop a "Call to Action" plan. Moving from "service" to "advocacy" is challenging for students and it requires commitment and extreme planning. Service involves direct actions or tasks to fulfill a need while advocacy focuses on addressing root causes and systemic issues. Making the shift requires a change in thinking from immediate action to long term impact. Unlike the immediate impact of service, advocacy work requires a sustained effort and students need to be patient and persistent.

Inspired by what they learned, Grade 12 students are working on an advocacy project taking place in April and the whole school community will be invited to participate.

Making sandwiches was the inspiration behind forming a team.

Last Lent, Colleen Girvin and I started the "Sandwich" club. Every Thursday, we made sandwiches and walked around uptown White Rock to deliver them to the homeless. Lent is an ideal time to engage in acts of kindness and service to the community and making sandwiches is an expression of the Lenten values of charity and compassion.

This Lenten activity inspired us to create a Social Justice Team spearheaded by mostly Grade 10 students. We meet weekly to come up with ideas which are in keeping with our mission and vision.

"From the beginning our club exists to serve, support and understand. We aim to open our hearts to those who want to speak and hold out our hands for those people in need. We work to understand those who struggle and we are committed to advocating for people in our community who need support. We believe that no act of kindness, no matter how small it is, is ever wasted. One small action is better than none". Social Justice Student Team

We came together as a group because we wanted to give back to our community. We have done a variety of activities which are designed to align with the teaching of compassion, love and service to others. We collected food for the food bank, packed cookies for the street ministry in the downtown eastside, and more locally, we made cards for seniors which we delivered before Christmas. We visited the same Seniors' Home on Shrove Tuesday where we helped them decorate cookies. We baked and packed over 60 bags of cookies for our soup kitchen diners, so we have been busy.

We braved the cold and snow flurries last Monday to deliver sandwiches. Our goal is to establish a relationship with the people we meet on the streets, and through one conversation already, we learned that they are always looking for sleeping bags. If you have any gently used sleeping bags you would like to donate, please drop off at the school office and we will distribute them.

We are grateful to the Knights of Columbus for assisting us financially with our "Sandwich Making" initiative.

Our next project will be to celebrate "Earth Day" in keeping with our Catholic Social Teaching; Care of God's Creation and Pope Francis's encyclical; "*Laudato Si*". We plan to collaborate with our Student Council on this initiative.

Rick's Heart Foundation

Rick's Heart Foundation is dedicated to collaborating on life-changing initiatives led with heart for our community. Our impact can be seen in the distribution of millions of essential hygiene supplies and blankets to those in need throughout BC, providing thousands of senior's access to lifegiving music in care facilities nationwide through Heart For Music, supporting like-minded organizations such as SUMS and Union Gospel Mission, the delivery of disaster supplies and emergency vehicles to over 30 countries, and more. We pride ourselves in being a diverse foundation, helping where we can, and making a significant impact in the lives of those who need it most in our communities.

The crippling impact of deep suffering in our community is overwhelming, evidenced by a growing presence of addiction, homelessness, and mental health. Emergency health services in BC report upwards of 200 calls a day related to drug overdoses. According to the Canadian Mental Health Association, approximately 17% (800,000) of British Columbians are experiencing mental illness and substance use issues. This is one of the reasons we are focused on making an impact to individuals in our community!

This year a new sewing program will launching with the City Dream Centre Surrey for women in recovery. This program will have a teacher to help instill the skills of sewing, practicing patience, and providing pride in their completed sewing projects. The first group of ladies will be creating quilts for their children, most of which are currently in the system until the women have completed their programs. This program will be making a meaningful and lasting difference in the lives of women in recovery within the lower mainland.

Thousands of older adults in BC and throughout Canada are marginalized and isolated, leaving hard-working staff to bear the responsibility and sometimes the financial burden to provide them with life-changing therapies and care. Heart for Music helps elders in local care homes by supporting providing music accounts, individual seniors with personal headsets, speakers, and music-playing tablets, and by live music events in the summer. Music has been clinically proven to improve the lives of those living with Dementia and Alzheimer's. Listening to music that is personalized has shown to unlock cherished memories and invoke positive emotions such as joy, peacefulness, and calmness. Our focus on the health and wellbeing of our local seniors drives our mission to bring them music therapy tools and the quality of life that everyone deserves.
